#### 1. Introduction

On 7 and 8 December 2021, the International Cluster Conference entitled "Clusters as drivers of resilient, digital and green economic competitiveness" was held within the framework of the GoDanuBio project. The event took place in Chisinau, being organized online due to COVID-19, through the Zoom Platform. It was also broadcasted live through several communication channels.

The event was organised by the Ministry of Economy of the Republic of Moldova and the EU4Moldova: Focal Regions Programme with the support of the Organization for Small and Medium Enterprises Sector Development (ODIMM), Romanian Cluster Association (CLUSTERO), and the Project "Participative Ecosystems for fostering the revitalization of rural-urban cooperation through governing Danube Circular Bioeconomy"- GoDanuBio (Danube Transnational Programme).

The conference was well attended with approximately 200 representatives of clusters, companies, RDI organizations, and regional and national public authorities.

#### 2. Concept and development

The International Cluster Conference, entitled "Clusters as drivers of resilient, digital and green economic competitiveness", aimed to inform about the role of clusters in the global economy and the start of the clustering process at national level as well as to rise the awareness about the importance of bioeconomy in the region. It had a focus on the Republic of Moldova, since the cluster landscape is still under development in this country and events of this kind have been scarce till date.

On the first day, the role of clusters as drivers of green, resilient, and digital transition was highlighted, in the context of the <u>new European industrial policy</u> of the European Commission, through interventions by officials of the Government of the Republic of Moldova, the European Commission, and representatives of the European Cluster Alliance (ECA).

During the thematic workshops, an exchange of good practices was made between the Romanian clusters and the emerging initiatives in the Republic of Moldova. The thematic fields concerned were: tourism, agri-food, textiles, wood, and furniture.

The second day was dedicated to the bioeconomy. BIOPRO Baden-Württemberg (Lead Partner of GoDanuBio) presented the project in the ECA Morning session with around 35 attendees. This session on 8 December included discussions about how clusters and, to some extent, public administration can shape circular bioeconomy ecosystems at regional, national and macro-regional levels.

Cluster representatives from Germany and Romania and a policy representative from the SME Agency of the Republic of Moldova participated to share their examples and practices. The presentations were followed by discussions and exchanges of ideas with the audience.

Later on in the plenary session (around 80 attendees), some funding programmes and measures to support the deployment of bio-based value chains in the Danube region were discussed. Among them was the new <u>Interregional Innovation Investments (I3)</u> and the <u>Green Innovation Programme (GIP)</u> of the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD). The second part of the second day was

dedicated to the best practices on mobilising bioeconomy regional excellence in countries such as Bulgaria, Hungary, Serbia and Slovakia, in line with what has been mapped and assessed in WP T2 so far.

#### 3. Impact and conclusions

The event was distributed by the www.privesc.eu and www.afaceri.ro portals, in the social pages of the organizers and partners and also on facebook.

The conference was live on facebook and had a very strong impact:

- The impact for the first day was 2,000 people.
- The impact for the second day was 1,800 people.

During the event, new models of collaboration that would accelerate economic development by revitalizing key sectors and providing a necessary environment for regional research, innovation and development were discussed, with a special focus on Moldavia. In this regard, more attention has been paid to opportunities to incorporate the dimensions of "circular economy" and "digitalisation" in the context of cluster development.

A key takeaway is that the sustainable development of clusters and the growth of their international competitiveness must be the result of the development and application of new technologies (e.g. digitalisation) and principles. This can be done, by updating the technological process, while respecting the principles of environmental protection.




