#### How does the strategy work?

- 1) 54+22 approved projects grouped into 12 Thematic Poles
- 2) For each pole: 1 project + 1 EUSDR PAC -> Pole leaders
- **3) Roadmap** created by each Pole -> Identified synergies + Foreseen activities
- 4) Communication ->> Synergies -> Capitalisation
- **5) Dynamic nature** of the poles
- 7) Open to other programmes
  - -> Invitation email sent







#### Analysis of the 1st year implementation

- Method: Online survey to Pole leaders, project partners and PACs
- <u>Results</u>: Positive direction taken by Poles and strong cooperation established with EUSDR PACs
- Challenges: definition and explanation of clear roles among involved actors and resources constraints
- **Solutions**:
- **CS Handbook**: provides answers to actors' questions related to CS implementation
- Meetings organised by JS
- Reallocation of project budget or include capitalisation budget (2<sup>nd</sup> call projects)
- Potential Capitalisation call?
